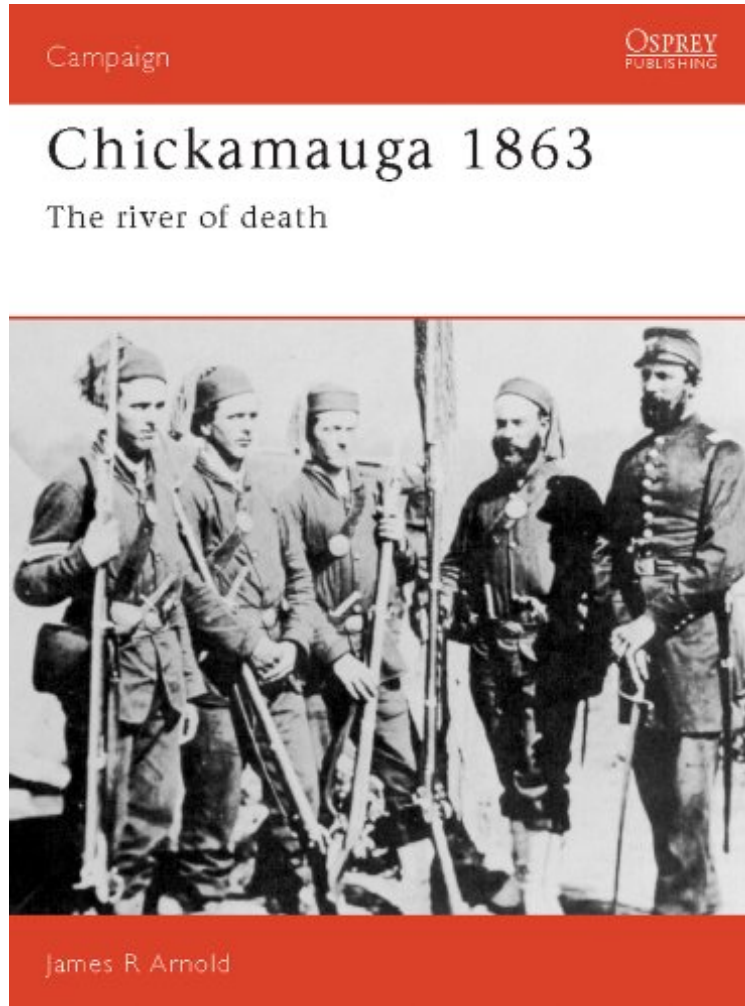

Der englische Text beschreibt die Akteure ebenso wie den Verlauf der Schlacht, so dass der Leser einen gute Gesamteindruck des Geschehens erhlt.Bei den - ansonsten guten - Karten mischen sich teils die Corps, Brigaden und Divisionen in einheitlicher Darstellung (roter oder blauer Balken), so dass man schnell den berblick verliert ohne die Ordre de Bataille neben sich liegen zu haben.Mangelhaft wie bei den meisten Ospreyheften sind die Verweise und Quellenangaben. Daher bleibt unklar, ob Informationen aus den "Official Records", Augenzeugenberichten oder sonstiger Quelle stammen.
