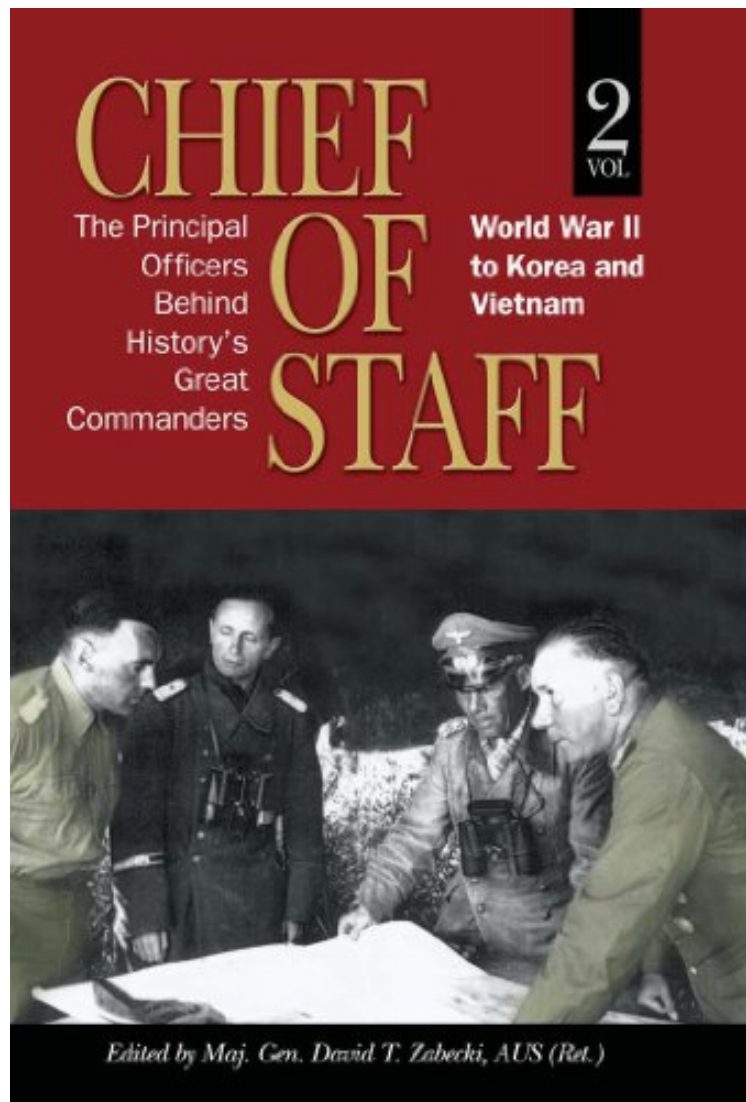

A rare look at the men who stood behind these great captains it provides insight into the complex decision making processes during operations. Moltkes dictum that only few commanders need no staff, and these commanders arise only once every few centuries, is shown true here. Zabecki starts with the development of the position of Chief of Staff in the Napoleonic Era, concentrates on the World Wars and finishes his work with Vietnam. The books give insights into the complex relationships between commanders and their Chief of Staffs and show how military staffs and planning have evolved over time. Most of the essays are carefully documented and exceedingly well written. Most of the professional soldiers presented here are unknown to a general audience. This work is highly advisable for all those interested in the processes of command.

Kurzbeschreibung The two-volume Chief of Staff examines the history, development, and role of the military duty position of the chief of staff. Many books have studied history's great commanders and the art of command. None have focused exclusively on the chief of staff that key staff officer responsible for translating the ideas of the commander into practical plans that common soldiers can execute successfully on the battlefield.
