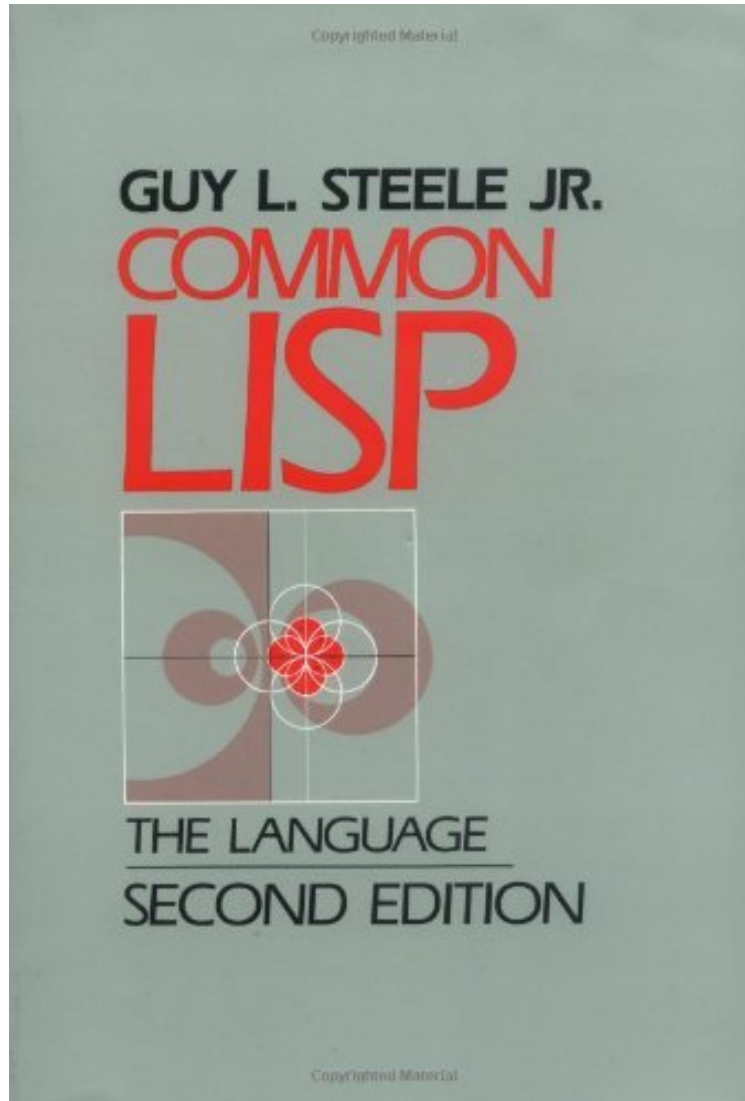

GLS is a terrific writer - very clear with a dry sense of humor that pervades the book, and has a number of

useful examples. While there are many parts of Common Lisp that can be difficult to comprehend at first glance (e.g., backquotes) GLS's presentation brings a clarity to the effort that makes it a pleasure to read (and in the case of FORMAT, read again and again! ;-)

Es macht in meinen Augen nicht viel Sinn, dieses Buch zu kritisieren, denn es bildet die Basis der meisten LISP-Implementierungen. Es gibt kaum ein gescheitertes Buch über Common Lisp, in dem auf CLtL2 nicht immer wieder Bezug genommen wird. Damit hat das Buch definierenden Charakter und Kritik an seinem Inhalt wre gewissermaßen Kritik an COMMON LISP und nicht an diesem Text.

Bleibt eigentlich nur noch der Schreibstil, bei dem man sich auslassen kann. Steele hat einfach Humor und ist ein souveräner und präziser Informatiker. Die Lektüre des Buches kann man bestimmt genießen, sofern man nicht den Fehler macht, es als LISP-Einführung zu verstehen. Dafür gibt es bessere Bücher, wie "Practical Common Lisp" von Peter Seibel.
