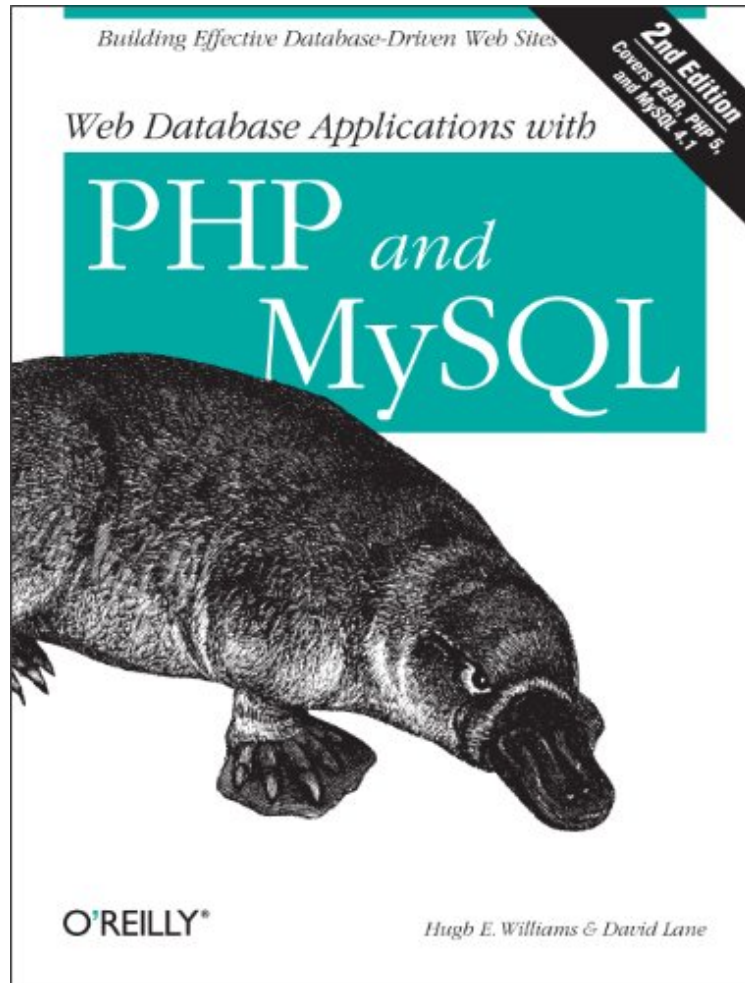

It not only discusses mere functionality, but also security problems, style, reuse etc. It is an excellent read for people who have not too much programming experience; but most people who are interested in
