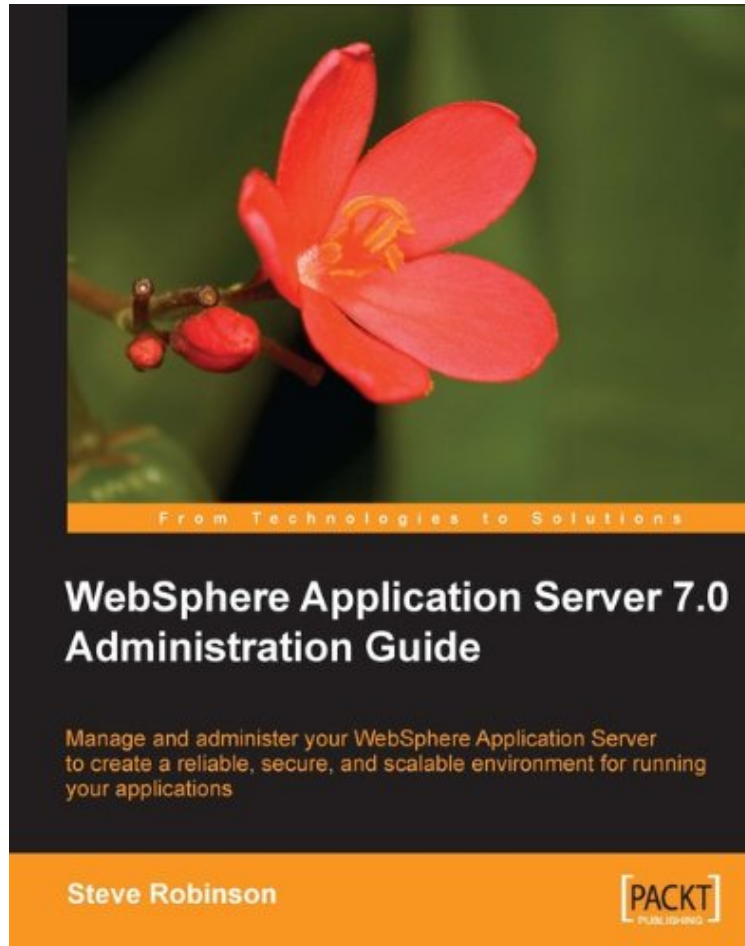

Also wenn man wirklich tief in die Materie WebSphere einsteigen möchte dann kommt man nicht drumherum, selber viel zu skripten und mit den vielfältigen Einstellungen eines WAS herumzuexperimentieren. Für den Umfang, den es bietet, ist das Buch aber wirklich qualitativ hochwertig und übersichtlich aufbereitet und recht präzise. Speziell im Kapitel LDAP sind zwar nicht gerade wenige Tippfehler, darüber sieht man aber geflissentlich hinweg, wenn einem die gebotenen Themen nicht gerade unbekannt sind und man auch ohne das Buch eine OpenLDAP-Installation hinkriegt.
