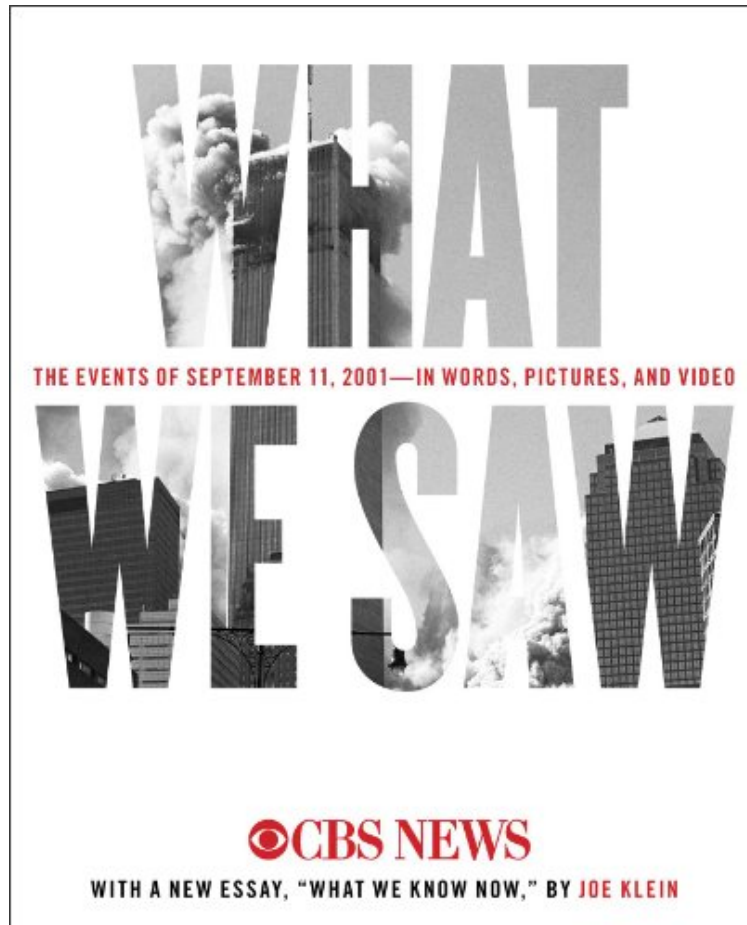

A. Mera This collection could have been so much better with just a little more effort. The book is a valuable collection (apart from the foreword by TV-Presenter Dan Rather conjuring up a lot of pathos with scenes of graveyard drums and bagpipe sounds). The news transcripts (CBS only; some shortened, sadly) are really worth reading, as well as some very touching texts which appeared in the days, weeks and months after the attacks in such highly regarded newspapers and magazines such as The Wall Street Journal, The New Yorker, The New York Times, Esquire, and Time Magazine. The texts are accompanied by those horrific and yet strangely beautiful pictures we only remember too well, all in black and white. The DVD starts off well, with a CBS-newsreel beginning just after the first plane hits the North Tower and ending with the collapse of the South Tower, presenting live interviews with firemen, nurses, office workers and family members of those lost in the tragedy. But some vital items are missing. The collapse of the North Tower is cut out from the time line, just like the crash of United flight 93 in Pennsylvania. Only much later in the documentary are these crucial parts of the attacks mentioned. And remember the scene where George W. Bush sits in that Florida primary school reading to children when a member of staff whispers the news in his ear and the President's face suddenly petrifies? Well, this historic moment is not on that DVD. Nor are any of the presidential addresses of that day.
